Overview of the Special edition

The Department of Sociology, University of Colombo, is planning to bring out a felicitation volume in honour of Professor Siri Hettige, Senior Professor of Sociology, University of Colombo. The volume will mark his retirement from the University in February 2016 and celebrate his contribution to the Social Sciences in Sri Lanka and across the world. Professor Hettige retired from the University in 2016 after forty years of distinguished service where he held the positions of a Senior Academic Staff member, Dean of the Faculty of Arts, Director Social Policy Analysis and Research Centre, Head Department of Sociology, and the Senior Student Counsellor. He has long been a



committed researcher and his contribution to the Sri Lankan Social Science literature is significant.

His contributions to the discipline has been in the areas of urban and rural studies, globalization and development, youth issues, employment and education, and the sociology of medicine to mention a few. His contemporaries, colleagues and students have been invited to contribute to this volume. Several papers have already been received for review. The global community working on Sri Lankan studies are welcome to make their contributions.

The felicitation volume, while honouring Professor Hettige, is expected to shed light on unexplored aspects of Sri Lankan society and thereby provide guidance for emerging young sociologists within and outside of Sri Lanka. This itself would be a celebration of the yeoman service rendered by Professor Hettige to Sri Lankan sociology.

Types of Manuscripts acceptable:

Papers can be in the form of research papers, case studies, reviews or opinions with focus on scientific research methodology and approaches. Papers should be original work, unpublished in whatever format elsewhere, in English language between 3,000 and 6,000 words with APA referencing. Language and methodologies used should be understandable and accessible to an international audience.
