Although the Abstract and Methods part are acceptable the authors did not present a research question. What is the main question addressed by the research? Was there a research hypothesis? This should be supplemented.

References are too old. Authors should follow the most recent publications. It would help to write an appropriate Introduction showing the state of art in a given topic.

Already the first sentence in the Introduction raises the suspicion that the data is out of date:

Over the past two decades, following rapid urbanization and high economic concentration, agriculture has developed significantly in urban and peri-urban areas of West Africa (Koffi et al. 2012).

Also in the Discussion, authors should focus on more recent literature (not older than 5 years). This will allow you to present the problem in the current state.
