Author should check whether the research article has two research designs. That is, descriptive statistics or a survey research design.

Key words should be put alphabetically.

Page 5, there is a hanging sentence. No one knows how it began or what it is communicating. It reads as follows: "and Western culture: A case study of Soyinka's Death and King's Horseman and The Lion and the Jewel' (Chika, 2011)."

To enrich his work, the author needs to read the article on "why study African religion today" and put it in his reference section,
